
















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


















Day to day operations of County services are funded through a combination of tax revenues and proprietary revenues



















Federal funding has helped our County weather the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, address revenue gaps, and preserve key services












Your proposed budget reflects the need – and our community's desire – for investments in key areas including housing, public safety, resilience, and transit








Pathways for the Future





Property taxes are a vital revenue source for our local government, and each year our County and its municipalities decide on next year's rates










We are proposing a historic millage cut in this year's budget, which will deliver the lowest combined tax rate for county residents since 1982












The proposed millage cut provides relief to families and enables us to make investments to preserve County services and advance key projects

Substitution Overall tax relief \$25 million









Deeper millage cuts would deliver very limited upfront relief to families in exchange for a significant cost to services down the line







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Puts at risk our future ability to:

- Prepare for Constitutional Offices
- Continue to renew and enhance our community assets
